Hi Jeremy,

Sorry the delayed response.

I want to be clear that we are in no way intending to delay the process of terminating awards. Instead, we are hoping to flag for the FO any awards that may have activities that fall into the lifesaving humanitarian assistance waiver, for FO consideration as to whether those awards should be terminated. Of course the decision whether to terminate the awards or not is entirely up to the FO. If you would like us to stand down on reviewing awards slated for termination to see whether they may have lifesaving humanitarian assistance activities, please let me know, and we will stand down.

Otherwise, as soon as we get the lists, we are rushing to review them, and then shooting up the list to Joel of awards that should be considered for not termination given that they may have lifesaving humanitarian assistance activities per the waiver.

As of now, we are caught up with reviewing all awards in the first 3 tranches, and stand ready to review any future awards, or not, if directed by the FO.

Nick,

I am hearing that Global Health is conducting supplemental reviews of awards slated for termination by Secretary Rubio and Acting Deputy Administrator Marocco. This is delaying the timely processing of these termination notices and is unacceptable.

As Jami's instructions made clear, the awards in each of the tranches cleared for termination have been extensively reviewed by State F, Secretary/Acting Administrator Rubio, and approved for termination by the full chain of command. Accordingly, bureaus should not be conducting their own policy and program reviews before acting on these termination instructions. Any concerns with specific awards slated for termination must be timely elevated to the USAID senior politicals and to Pete Marocco. Such concerns should be limited to essential and mission critical issues only. Any alternative process risks undermining the determinations and intent of Acting Administrator Rubio and Acting Deputy Administrator Marocco.
