Hi Mark,

Thanks for agreeing to engage Joel and others in the FO on clarifying the lifesaving humanitarian assistance waiver approval guidance to ensure that approval of these critical activities is not delayed. Based on Joel's February 19 email (copied below), activities included in the spreadsheet are already approved by Bureaus and Independent Offices as life-saving. However, the [standing Agency guidance](#) sent by ES on Feb. 14th says that SBO Jackson needs to approve the activities.

We have proposed minor edits to the standing Agency guidance in [this document](#), in order to clarify that SBO Jackson does not need to approve lifesaving activities - as they are already approved - but that he still needs the list of activities and the forms in order to approve the **payment**.

Our request is for Joel/Ken to sign off on these minor changes to the guidance

Hi Teammates,

Mark and Nick are tracking the PPE issues. We are directed to let WHO know we are picking up our items and we need to figure out a way to get them and deliver them to the right people/organizations in need. This will be a priority. Please keep me updated throughout the process. Please leverage the CST for any type of assistance.

Additionally, life saving things like Marburg do not need a waiver (so there should be no pause). They do need to go through the payment approval process. I understand there have been challenges as we have updated the payment process, but let's not have that get in the way of getting things approved. Please use the process in place (emailing me directly is not the right solution), use the chain of command, prioritize things like infectious diseases, and reflag issues that seem like they are sitting and should not be.

Mark and Brian, you are the leads on this, but please rely on Nick and Julie's expertise.
